
## CITIZENS' SUMMARY 2019



Interreg Atlantic Area Programme is a financing instrument of European Territorial Cooperation which aims to provide a framework for the implementation of joint actions, good practices and policy exchange between actors of five Atlantic countries: Portugal, Spain, France, Ireland and the United Kingdom.

With the support of the European Union the programme has a total budget of EUR 185 million, out of which EUR 140 million come from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF). The 72 funded projects reflect the objective of sustainable social and economic growth in the Atlantic Area, articulated in four main priority areas.

### INTERREG ATLANTIC AREA AT PANORAMA MAGAZINE

On a joint initiative of Interreg transnational programmes, we contributed to an article at Panorama, a magazine dedicated to the Regional Policy. Project AYCH was identified as a good practice in the entrepreneurship field.

#### IF YOU START ME UP, I'LL NEVER STOP

In the Atlantic Youth Creative Hubs project, partners have created a transnational platform to empower young creatives. In 'creative jam sessions' they help people aged between 16 and 30 to implement their business ideas from scratch. One example is João, who says that he 'found inspiration, training and coaching for enterpreneurship and learned a lot about brand management'. Today, he is a successful young fashion designer in Portugal. Soon after the jam session he joined the fashion business and the Santo Tirso factory design incubator in Porto and went on to win the Portuguese New Creators Fashion Contest, making his debut at Portugal's most important national fashion event.

Helping start-uppers to start João is proof that an entrepreneurial spirit is important but not enough. Starting a company requires skills and knowledge that young entrepreneurs often lack. (...)
